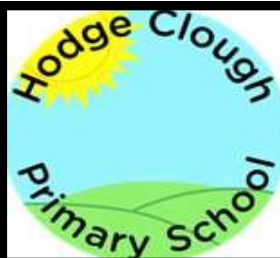

Year 4 Newsletter

Autumn Term 2019

Dear Parent / Guardian,

We wish to welcome you back to the Autumn term. We hope that you and your family have had an enjoyable summer and we are looking forward to a successful first term.

During the Autumn Term, we will have daily lessons in English. We will be concentrating on our comprehension skills, and the writing and editing process. We will also be continuing with our spelling scheme and working to improve our handwriting.



In Mathematics we will be counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 100. We will also begin to recognise the place value of each digit in a four-digit number and round, order and compare numbers beyond 1,000. As well as this, we will learn to read and write Roman numerals to 100. We will continue to work on the four operations, adding and subtracting 4 digit number and multiplying and dividing by 10 & 100 as well as 6,7 & 9. Length and perimeter will also be introduced in this term.



Science during the Autumn term will be Animals including humans and Living things and their habitats.

This term we will be studying The Romans in Britain in history, and All around the World in Geography. Alongside this in Computing we will be learning Word processing skills and Online & Internet safety.



The children will continue to learn French, recapping basic conversational French from Year 3 and beginning to learn pets, colours and All about Christmas.



In Art, we will be studying the work of Anselm Kiefer, a German artist inspired by the ruins of post war Germany. In music, the children will be learning to play the Glockenspiel and focussing on music inspired by the song Blackbird, by The Beatles. Our RE this term will be What can we learn from stories in the Bible?

PE lessons on a Monday will be taught by Miss White and Thursday lessons will be taught by ourselves, with a focus on Multi-skills.
